Thank you, thank you, thank you for all you've done this year in Christ's name.


And a personal thank you for all the cards and sweets you've given to me this Christmas season!

Altar Guild Notes: January, 2025

It's cold and dark. But there is a light shining in the darkness!

We enter January at the conclusion of the Christmas season. The first Sunday is the second (& last Sunday) of the Christmas season. We will celebrate The Feast of Epiphany because January 6 is the very next day. The Christmas paraments are still in place as Epiphany is represented on the pulpit panel hanging on right side. You see the three kings following the star. The Gospel reading tells us the magi returned to their home countries with the good news of the Infant Christ. Jesus is the glory revealed to all nations! Now let's look above the altar panel





to see the veil covering the chalice. Notice the Jerusalem cross embroidered there. The four crosses in the corners surrounding the cross of Christ represent the four corners of the earth, an illustration of Christ revealed to the world!

The second Sunday looks dramatically different. Trees, decorations, extra candles are gone. Today the baptismal font is front and center. Paraments are changed, but they are still white. It's another festival, The Baptism of our Lord! The readings today bring us to meet Jesus at the River Jordan. Jesus enters the water to be baptized when God speaks, naming Jesus his beloved son. Water and the Word combined as a sacrament continues to be used at every baptism as we are named child of God.

Third Sunday, another change. Green paraments in place, font is returned to the side, different banners appear. It's Time after Epiphany for the following six Sundays. Jesus is made manifest among us. His time is spent preaching, teaching, and proclaiming a message of love.

Fourth Sunday, time to settle in as we are greeted again with the same green surroundings inside even as the outside world is gray and nippy. Eyes and hearts were opened then (epiphanies...) as Jesus



incarnate walked His winding road towards the cross. We are still listening today.

May His light burn bright in us & our faith community to bring out to the world now. Keep Jesus in your heart.

- ♦ In times of personal crisis or struggle in which you may benefit from direct pastoral care.
- ♦ When in need of pastoral services such as baptisms, weddings, home communion, funeral, or memorial services.
- ♦ In any other circumstance where pastoral care may benefit you. When in doubt, call.
